FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

In 2019, so much of our hard work came to fruition, from the ground up—rooted in the training of community facilitators. I was so moved to see 60 officers of the Hope Project Self Help Groups learning the new re-set exercises to share them with their groups of 15 to 20 women each. The same enthusiasm to teach self-care flowered in the Hope Project school, clinic, vocational & support classes, and in outreach to neighborhoods in need. And, in the palliative work of the home care teams at CanSupport, more counselors than ever stepped forward to bring the TSP exercises into patients' homes.

We are no longer introducing TSP self-care—it is being practiced and sustained by these communities!

In the Navajo Nation, TSP's program with mothers expanded through partnership with NW NM FIrst Born, which works with hundreds of families. In August, we began a training in stress-relief practices for First Born advocates and their clients. What's in a Story, TSP's literacy, historic identity & wellness program for elementary school children continued strong as our team found new venues and was welcomed back to established ones.


1700 New Mexico Navajo Nation students, 224 Santa Fe County students served, 210 students & 25 teachers in West Bengal, India served


220 mothers, teachers and social workers in NM Navajo Nation served
